Similarly "immersive" productions — "Sleep No More," "Here Lies Love," "Natasha, Pierre and the Great Comet of 1812" — have been invigorating the Off Broadway scene lately. "The Blind" was an adventurous, eerie and for me thoroughly engaging example of the genre, all the more pleasurable because instead of being required to wander around in search of entertainment, as at "Sleep No More," you were able to sit still, and concentrate on the layering of the voices and the plaintive tale. ...
